### Overview

The Iowa Soybean Association (ISA) is seeking research proposals for projects beginning **October 1, 2026**. The ISA Board funds projects that advance its mission to **increase soybean farmer competitiveness through improved productivity, profitability, and sustainability**. ISA supports **applied and basic research, as well as Extension and Outreach**, that provide **practical short- and long-term benefits to Iowa soybean farmers**.

### Priority Research Areas

Proposals should align with one of the following focus areas:

#### **Soybean Germplasm Discovery and Improvement**

- Breeding efforts to **increase genetic yield potential and introduce defensive traits**

#### **Pest and Disease Management**

- Biology, management, and yield loss mitigation for diseases, nematodes, insect pests, abiotic stresses

#### **Weed Management**

- Weed management strategies within **soybean cropping systems**

#### **Nutrient and Water Management**

- Soybean production practices that **improve nutrient management and water quality**

#### **Post-Harvest Seed Handling**

- Practices to **maintain or improve seed quality after harvest**

#### **Soybean Production Systems and Agronomics**

- Soybean cropping system production practices, agronomics, and management to enhance productivity, profitability, and sustainability, including digital agriculture, new technologies, and modeling for research, production, and economic impact.

### Proposal Requirements

**Written proposal** - includes the following:

- Cover Sheet and Budget Summary Spreadsheet (*form provided*)
- Proposal Template (*form provided*) – **concise and targeted to farmer audience**
- Allowed and not allowed expenses (*provided for reference only – do not include with submission*)

### Proposal Requirements *(continued)*

#### Short Video Summary:

- Submit a **3-minute (or less) video** for the ISA Farmer Board of Directors that:
    - Summarizes the research project
    - Explains **how it will benefit Iowa soybean farmers**
    - Describes how it will help farmers become more **productive, profitable, and/or sustainable**
    - Outlines the **expected outcomes for Iowa farmers or the soybean industry**
  - Video guidelines
    - Resolution: 1080p at 30 fps
    - Record horizontally (landscape)
    - Center the subject in the frame
    - Most modern cell phones meet these requirements
- 

### General Information

For **multi-year proposals**, continued funding will depend on the progress demonstrated and meaningful results from earlier years.

Researchers are strongly encouraged to pursue **interdisciplinary collaborations**, including partnerships with **other institutions**, when appropriate. Prior conversation is recommended if you would like to partner with or leverage ISA's Research Center for Farming Innovation.
